### **RCM I & II Report From Regional Meeting 7/26/09**

**8/11/09**

Hello everyone at ASC,

Joey and I have quite a bit of information to go over today, however, first I would like to clear up an issue brought forth by one of the home groups at last months area. I say "I" because Joey did not attend the last Region, therefore, it's not appropriate in my opinion to put him on the spot unless he wishes to speak on the matter.

One of our groups was concerned that the Regional Guidelines passed without going back to groups. I was caught off guard at that meeting (I can get dingy when put on the spot) and don't feel that I addressed this issue thoroughly. Here is what actually happened for clarification:

1. I did bring the Regional Guidelines back to area to discuss and looked at everyone in the room and waved them around receiving no feedback as to suggestions of what to do.
2. At that very same meeting, Anthony graciously suggested that he put them up on the website so that any groups wishing to have feedback could bring it to our next area. This was done. Thank you Anthony.
3. Now, I do realize that the Regional Meeting was 7/11/09, where the guidelines passed, and our area meeting was 7/14/09. However, I would ask if any of the groups actually read the

guidelines from the website or actually had any feedback? Keep in mind that these guidelines are not set in stone. Anything that the groups do not like in Regional Guidelines can be brought to ASC and if the ASC comes to a group conscious, we can send that concern to Region. It certainly can be done anytime. So, if any group had issues, we still could have addressed them at last ASC.

4. There were RCS's and our RD alt. that brought forth items via email concerning the guidelines that passed. Mainly clean up procedures. I printed them out and am more than willing to pass on. At Region we agreed to have Mike H. incorporate these changes to the Regional Guidelines. There was TON'S of discussion on this issue at Region so our area was not the only one befuddled.
5. One last thing on the subject; Joey and I are your trusted servants and are here to serve the groups. This issue was good for me because I took the opportunity to re-read the 12 Concepts To Service. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Concept talks about freeing up the groups to do the most important job of carrying the message to the addicts who still suffer and not being bogged down in housekeeping issues. We are not trying to govern any group. We are here to serve you and we don't want to distract from your primary purpose. We hope that you trust us to do the job you have elected us to do which is also covered in the Concepts. Trust that we will bring back issues that are out of the norm. Guidelines are normal housekeeping items. Thank you so much for indulging me.

#### **Activities:**

Day of the Dinosaurs was very successful. 200 people attended and the total collections were \$1940.63. Of course out of that amount will be deducted expenses but they did profit from the function.

Woman's Spiritual Breakfast was also a smash profiting \$350 check given to Region. 106 woman attended which were only 6 down from last years.

There were accountability issues brought up for this function and whether they are a Regional Function or not. It was decided that they will be part of Regional Activities and put into those Guidelines. Shelly O. assured the Committee that they will be represented at the Subcommittee Meetings from here on.

#### **H&I:**

H&I Learning Days is tentatively.... TENTATIVELY, scheduled for Sept. 12 at Sahara Library from 1-5. They are waiting for feedback from World.

#### **PI or PR:**

Phone Line Tom discussed calls coming through phone line. 1294 calls came in, 84% of those calls were successful, 11% hung up due to wait time, and I forgot what the other 5% were. They are looking to broadcast these calls to several addicts at one time instead of the tier system. On the current system, the calls **go to one addict for 5** rings, then on to the next and on to the next. Right now we have 38 people on the phone line so more willing addicts are always welcome.

ATTENTION!!!! Convention Guidelines for Region are going back to groups for suggestions. This is the final draft and WILL be voted on at our next regional meeting SEPT. 20 10:00 am – 1:00 pm

This committee had disbanded but we asked them to (reband, LOL) continue on until these guidelines were completely passed and Chris S. agreed on their behalf as Shelly and Ira were at the Zonal Forum.

We're looking at having the convention April 2010.

Region 51 Convention Guideline Committee Report  
August 11, 2009

I would like to begin by thanking you for the privilege of allowing me to be one of the two representatives from the North by Northwest Area in writing the regional convention guidelines. We have finished the guidelines and submitted them to the region for review by each area. As of this time this subcommittee has disbanded until the areas have come back with feedback and input.

I have included the report that was submitted to the RSC on July 26 by Mitch G. I believe this explains how our last meeting concluded.

Dear RCM's,

Please find minutes from last Convention guidelines committee. Several of the members have mentioned that they are frustrated that the process has taken so long. They took a group conscience at their last meeting and believed their work was complete as the guidelines were finished. They also suggested an election process for electing a Convention chair. This was the same process used to form the guidelines committee.

It was suggested that each area send representatives to the Standing regional convention subcommittee at 10 am September RSC meeting for the purpose of electing a Chairperson, they should also be willing to serve on the convention committee in any capacity. Once a chairperson has been elected and acclimated by the RSC at the elections in Sept., the committee will hold its own elections for all of the many convention positions. This will be open to the entire fellowship.

The guidelines are out for approval, the seed fund for the convention was passed. In order to proceed in a timely manner we should establish the convention committee if we are to have a convention in 2010. There is time to do this but delaying may close the window of opportunity. The committee that is put together can revise their own guidelines if changes need to be made, or write their own if they do not like the existing ones. Please get back to me if your areas are willing to send 2 members to be on the committee and take part in electing their chairperson in September.
